# Epiphany Update

For three days in April and months prior in preparation, congregational leaders met with leaders of Hope Partnership Ministries of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) to worship, pray, ponder, and create new ministry possibilities at National City Christian Church. Rev. Rick Morse and Rev. Roger McKinney joined us for dynamic days of team building and leadership exercises with the goal of developing and living into a future story of vibrant and relevant ministry for our congregation. Forty-nine members gathered to share personal stories of spiritual transformation that had occurred in their lives while at National City and think about ways for transformational ministry to continue for future generations.

Now Epiphany writers have met to do the work of putting together a possible "Future Story" for our ministry together. I am grateful to the writers: Aixa Diaz, Sadye Sanders, Chip Talbott, Shana Williams, Jane Campbell, Steven Baines, and Rick Morse. The

next step is the creation of the Building Capacity Report by Rick Morse. With this report, we will consider the questions: What adaptive changes do we need to make? What technical skills do we need to have as a congregation? What kind of leadership -- staff and lay leadership -- do we need to make these transitions? What will it cost? How do we do it?

By the end of the summer, a full report will be presented to the Congregational Board and then presented to the congregation. Rev. Rick Morse will continue to work with our congregation as our coach for a year as we begin the Epiphany process.

My continued prayer -- one that I hope you will pray with me -- is that as we journey together, we will fully realize our potential as a transformational congregation and be a witness of transformed lives in Christ to our community and our world.



# Old Emergency Generator To Be Replaced Thanks to a \$50,000 Grant

The National City Christian Church Foundation has been awarded a \$50,000 grant from a family foundation to replace the emergency generator which serves as backup for electrical service to the Sanctuary and Beasley Buildings.

In the case of a power failure, e.g., key services, such as the elevator, will continue to function.

A functioning emergency generator is required by D.C. law. As you can see from the photo, which was taken on the rooftop of the Beasley Building, the old emergency generator was in very poor condition.

We celebrate this important improvement in the functioning of mechanical systems of our church, so that our work of vital missions can continue unabated.

The Food Pantry team would like to remind all young people who need volunteer hours for school that that they are very welcome to help in the Food Pantry any Wednesday between 10 a.m. and 1 p.m. All volunteers are welcome to this rewarding ministry.

The Food Pantry mission has been greatly enhanced by the addition of Tony Johnson and his personal ministry. By merging the resources of National City with the activities of other churches in the downtown cluster, along with new projects of his own making, Tony has added a new dimension to our Food Pantry. He has expanded our food donations to include personal hygiene bags during the Wednesday hours and out on the street throughout the Ward.

Food Pantry depends on the support of members and friends of National City Christian Church to continue this important mission. We always need items such as: Shelf-stable products such as canned or packaged soups, canned fruits or vegetables, canned protein (tuna, chicken, ravioli, spam), pasta, spaghetti sauce, crackers and granola bars, juice boxes, bottled water, applesauce, and fruit cups.

Good personal hygiene is essential for restoring personal dignity, so donations of items such as toothbrushes and toothpaste, dental floss, soap, shampoo, wet wipes, washcloths, socks, zip lock bags, combs, razors, deodorant, lotion, nail clippers, and lip balm are appreciated. If you are more comfortable making a financial contribution, that is always appreciated. Just make a note on the check that it is to be directed to the NCCC Food Pantry.
