While we are keenly aware that production values have not been ideal at times, we recognize we are novices when it comes to media production that features the high quality, studio-produced videos we have grown accustomed to seeing during the pandemic. But we know the spirit of Christ has been with us no matter if sitting on a couch in your pajamas, eating a muffin around the kitchen table, or praying fervently for a smooth service with no sound glitches and iPad memory shortages. Additionally, the homeless are always in need of hygiene products like soap, shampoo, deodorant, shaving cream and disposable razors, feminine napkins, and washcloths.
